Success Through Collaboration with IBPS

As schools are under increased pressure to improve student performance and to prepare more students for college and careers, effective collaboration through Interest Based Problem Solving (IBPS) is vital. This is being achieved in PUSD through:

- Teachers engaging on school and district governing bodies to offer classroom perspectives and professional expertise
- Teachers on special assignments supporting practicing teachers as well as students
- Teachers participating in professional growth and development pertinent to their students' and site needs
- Teachers & District seeking creative uses of time to effectively plan, practice, and develop their teaching craft
- Teacher professionals developing, adapting, and selecting resources and instructional materials
